

## ORGANIC CHEMISTRY DIDACTIC RULES

### 2<sup>nd</sup> year, field of study - Pharmacy

1. The Organic Chemistry Course for the second year of studies at the Faculty of Pharmacy, field of study: Pharmacy, comprises annually: 40 hours of lectures, 38 hours of seminars and 112 hours of laboratory and ends with an exam. A student may take the exam after obtaining credits from lectures, laboratories and seminars in the winter and summer semesters.
2. The laboratory programme includes 8 colloquia (4 in the winter semester and 4 in the summer semester). A maximum of 165 credits (85 credits in the winter semester and 80 credits in the summer semester) can be obtained for the colloquia.
3. The prerequisites for passing the organic chemistry lab are:
  - attendance at all exercises,
  - completion and development of exercises included in the course plan,
  - passing colloquia provided for in the course schedule.
4. The laboratory provides for the completion of 8 preparations (3 in the winter semester and 5 in the summer semester), for which a maximum of 15 credits may be obtained in total in the winter semester (5 credits for each preparation) and 20 credits in the summer semester (4 credits per preparation).
5. In total, a maximum of 100 credits can be obtained from the laboratory in each semester.
6. Passing of the laboratory in a given semester is achieved by obtaining a minimum of 60% of the total points possible.
7. The prerequisites for passing the seminars are:
  - attendance in class,
  - passing of the intermediate tests and the final test.
8. Credit for the seminar is awarded after obtaining a minimum of 60% of the total points possible to be obtained in a given semester.
9. If a student does not obtain the required number of points in the seminar and/or in the laboratory, he/she is entitled to 2 terms of a revision test.
10. If a student misses a class due to an excuse, he/she is obliged to make up the missed class at a date agreed with the teacher. In the case of a student's absence at the test, confirmed by a medical certificate, the student shall take the test at the earliest possible date.
11. The final examination takes place in written form.
12. A student has the right to take the exam on a zero-term if he/she obtains a minimum of 85% of the total number of points from the laboratory and seminar in each semester.
