REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE TEACHING OF PATHOPHYSIOLOGY

FOR SECOND-YEAR MEDICINE STUDENTS

ENGLISH DIVISION

Summer Semester of the Academic Year 2024/2025

- 1. The curriculum for the pathophysiology course comprises 30 hours of lectures and 45 hours of tutorials.
- 2. Essential information pertaining to the didactic process is made available on the notice board of the Department of Pathophysiology as well as on its official website: https://www.wf.cm.umk.pl/katpatofiz/english-division/.
- 3. All classes are conducted in strict accordance with the timetable established by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine on the dates designated for each didactic group.
- 4. A student may request a change of their assigned group only in conjunction with a formal transfer to another dean's group, subject to the approval of the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine.
- 5. Tutorials and lectures shall be held in the classroom indicated in the official timetable.
- 6. Attendance at tutorials is compulsory. Any absence must be officially excused, and the missed tutorial must be completed in consultation with the designated tutor. The completion process should occur within seven days following the cessation of the reason for the absence.
- 7. Each student bears full responsibility for preparing for the assigned tutorial, utilizing the literature and materials provided.
- 8. Every student is required to prepare a project or multimedia presentation on a preselected thematic topic. The successful completion of this assignment is a prerequisite for passing the tutorials in pathophysiology.
- 9. Partial tests shall be administered during lectures 5, 9, and 14, in strict adherence to the pre-established schedule.
- 10. Verification of learning outcomes in pathophysiology is based on the following grading scale:

- 11. The course culminates in a final examination, covering the entirety of the material presented in both tutorials and lectures. Passing all three partial tests is a prerequisite for being admitted to the final examination.
- 12. A medical certificate substantiating an absence from a partial test or the final examination must be submitted within seven days of the respective test date via USOS email.
- 13. All electronic correspondence from students must be conducted exclusively using the @stud.umk.pl email domain.
- 14. The Head of the Department of Pathophysiology, Prof. dr. hab. Ewa Żekanowska, is available to receive students every Wednesday from 11:00 to 12:30.
- 15. The teaching assistant, Dr. hab. Artur Słomka, Prof. NCU, holds consultation hours with students every Monday from 11:30 to 13:00.
